TECHNICAL GUIDE

NOVEMBER 22-24, 2013











Event Information

The Los Angeles Grand Prix (LAGP) is a three day international caliber track cycling event held at the VELO Sports Center (VSC) on the campus of StubHub Center(SHC). The LAGP will serve as a point accumulation opportunity for athletes to qualify for the UCI World Cups later in the year. In addition to hosting domestic and international elite competitors the race will also integrate adaptive sport by running events that will make up the 2013 U.S. Paralympics Track Cycling National Championships. The VELO Sports Center is owned and operated by AEG. AEG has a long standing history in premier cycling events including; 2004 UCI Junior World Championship, 2005 UCI Elite World Championships, 2006-2008 UCI World Cups, and most notably the Amgen Tour of California.









Regulations

Article 1. Organization

The 2013 Los Angeles Grand Prix is organized by the VELO Sports Center at StubHub! Center, under the regulations of the International Cycling Union (UCI). The race will be held from November 22-24, 2013. The race directors are Adam Duvendeck and Christopher Reed. The organization address is:

Article 2. Type of Event

The event is open to athletes of the Men's and Women's Elite categories, along with select events for Men's and Women's Jr. Categories. The event is entered on the UCI Track Calendar and has been assigned a UCI Class 1 Ranking. Reference the UCI website - www.uci.ch for point breakdown. This event will also serve as the U.S. Paralympics Track Cycling National Championships.

Article 3. Participation

As per article 3.4.004 of the UCI Regulations, the event is open to National Teams, Registered Track Trade teams, and elite riders holding a UCI licence aged 18 and over. The age of a rider shall be determined by the difference between the year of the last leg of the applicable world cup and the year of his/her birth. Junior competition is open to Juniors 16-18 years of age holding a USA Cycling or UCI License of category 3 or higher.

Para-Cycling - Para cycling athletes must be class C1-5 or M/WB with a USA Cycling racing License.

Article 4. Race Headquarters

The race headquarters will be held at the VELO Sports Center at the address given above.

Team representatives or individuals competing are requested to confirm their starters and collect their race numbers at the VELO Sports Center Lobby from 3pm-5pm on Thursday November 21st, 2013.

The team managers/riders meeting is scheduled to be held at 5pm on Thursday November 21st, 2013. The meeting will take place in section 113 of the VSC Stands.

Article 5. Prizes

A grand total of \$7450.00US will be awarded in prize money in the following arrangement.

Article 6. Anti-Doping

The UCI and USADA anti doping regulations are entirely applicable and enforceable for the event. It is the riders and team manager's responsibility to understand these rules. The Anti-Doping room will be held at the Tennis Stadium. There will be a board on the infield adjacent to the officials stage where the riders chosen for anti-doping control will be posted - identified by their bib number,

Article 7. Awards Ceremony

In accordance with article 1.2.112 of the UCI Rules, the top three individuals or teams in every event must attend the official awards ceremony on a daily basis. The riders will present themselves at the podium immediately before the start of an awards ceremony as posted on the event schedule.

Article 8. Penalties

The UCI Penalty scale is the only one applicable.

Article 9. Results

Results will be released after signed by the race secretary. Results will be distributed to the team/rider boxes located on the infield.

Article 10. Rider Identification

At all times a rider must use both numbers provided to them. The only exception to this rule is for the Team Pursuit and Team Omnium where riders may wear one number.

Article 11. Dismissal

Where it is deemed that the image or reputation of the Los Angeles Grand Prix may be blemished, notably with the regard to anti-doping measures and the behavior of any member of a team (management or athlete), the organizer reserves the right at any time during the race to exclude the rider(s) or the team members involved.

Article 12. Accommodations

Housing and Food accommodations are the responsibility of the team or individual racing. A special preferred rate has been provided by the Double Tree by Hilton Carson for team participants and race staff. The Double Tree will serve as the Official Team Hotel for the Los Angeles Grand Prix cycling, a full service hotel located just off of the I-405 and Carson Street, less than 2 miles from the VELO Sports Center.
